
Please be advised that *N.C. Gen. Stat. § 7B-1703* requires that the intake decision, whether to approve or not approve the complaint for juvenile court, be made within fifteen (15) days of Court Services' receipt of the complaint. In order to make the best decision possible, we would like to hear from you as the victim in this delinquent incident. Your input is valuable, so please complete the enclosed Victim Impact Statement [*Form CS 004a*] and send it to the address listed on the enclosed form within **seven (7) business days** or as soon as possible.

Please provide as much information on the enclosed Victim Impact Statement as possible to help me make an informed decision. In an effort to hold the juvenile accountable for his/her actions, your request for restitution will be considered; however, monetary compensation is not always guaranteed. Other options for recovering loss may be available and can be discussed with you at your request.

If you would like to speak with me personally or if you have additional information that you would like to share, I can schedule a personal interview with you by telephone or in person. Please contact (910) 986-9129 if you would like to have a personal interview.

If this matter is approved for court, this information will be provided to and may be used by the District Attorney. As the victim of this offense, you may also receive additional victim information from Juvenile Justice or the District Attorney's Office.
